INTRODUCTION

- Kadoma has a population of 117380.
- Per capita waste generation of 0.26kg
- Waste generation of about 30t/day.
- Recyclable waste constitute 18%.
- Translates to 5.4 tonnes per day of recyclables.
- These include PET and LPDE plastics, metal, glass and paper.
- Recycling reduces waste burden at the landfill site.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- Waste collection for recycling.
- Currently done by a community based group.
- Involves waste picking from our disposal site.
- Collection of PET and LDPE from designated cages at shopping centres.
- Cleaning, bailing, Shredding(pelletizing) and packaging for marketing.
