<b>Key points made in the inputs and discussion</b>	<p>Participants we unanimous in that gender based violence is a serious concern in the country and that it has not received appropriate attention in the media.</p> <p>Lack of deep understanding of the various forms of GVB and the difficult in accessing sources of information was presented as one of the challenges journalists face when reporting on GBV.</p>
<b>Outputs</b>	The facilitator was interviewed by two television stations (ECO TV and Televisao Independente de Mocambique) for their evening broadcast. Participants had the opportunity to take a field trip to Namaacha, one of the councils that are part of Local Government Centre of Excellence in Gender Mainstreaming. It is expected that a number of stories will be produced and published in the coming week.
